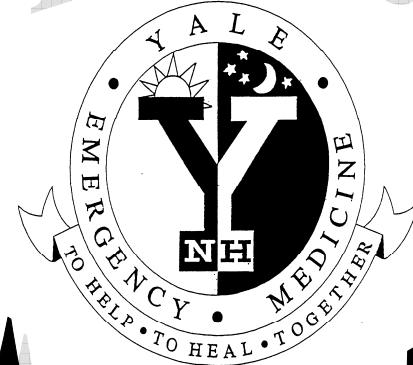
Project ASSERT is a Yale-New Haven Hospital Emergency Department (YNHH ED) Service to help patients access primary care and drug and alcohol treatment services. Health Promotion Advocates (HPAs) work with patients in the YNHH Emergency Department. They help to find health problems that may need treatment.

One of the HPAs has talked to you about your health and about things that you do now to keep yourself healthy. You may also be told about other things that you can do to keep from getting sick.

Project ASSERT is a collaborative effort between Yale-New Haven Hospital and the Section of Emergency Medicine, Yale University School of Medicine, New Haven, CT.

Alcohol and drug problems affect people from all walks of life and backgrounds. Family, friends, coworkers or neighbors may be drinking at unsafe levels or using drugs which could lead to problems including injuries, domestic violence or illnesses such as heart disease and cancer.

Early intervention can help and is often cost effective. Like other chronic diseases, drug and alcohol problems can be treated.

Project ASSERT provides a Community Outreach model to reduce alcohol and other drug problems, as well as high risk health and social behaviors. By providing information and education on a wide variety of topics including: HIV/AIDS, tobacco, alcohol and other drugs, and women's health, ASSERT is identifying risks, intervening when possible and connecting people with primary care & community resources.
