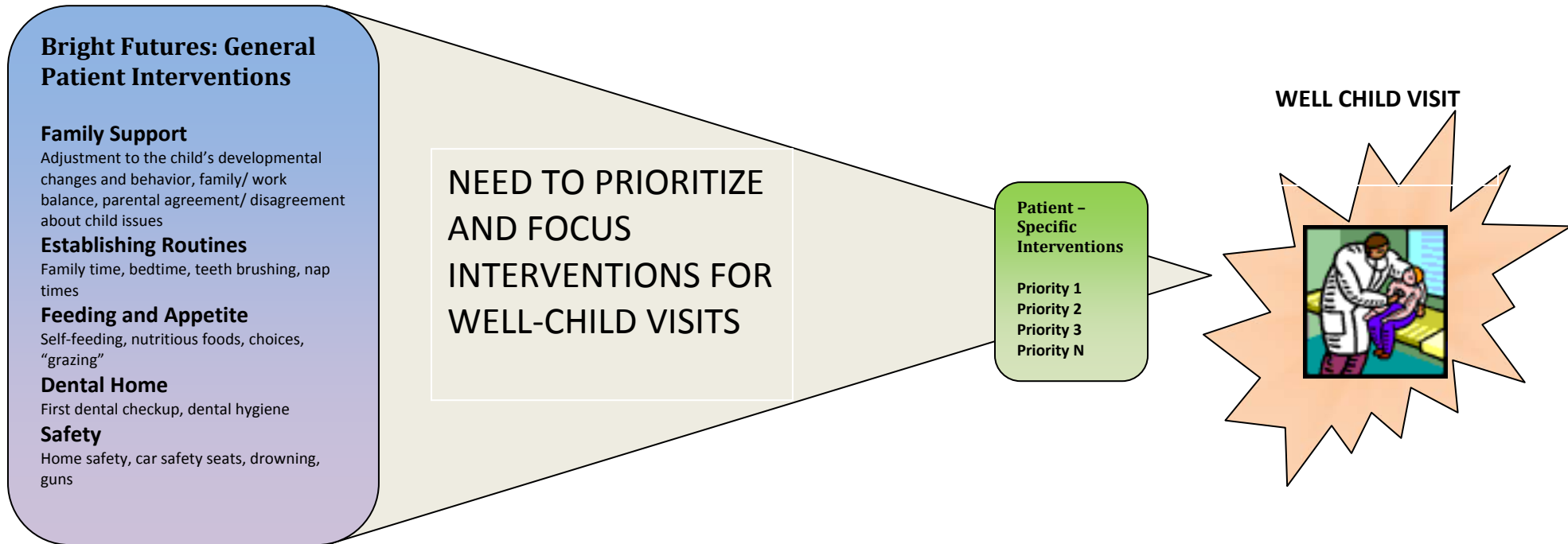
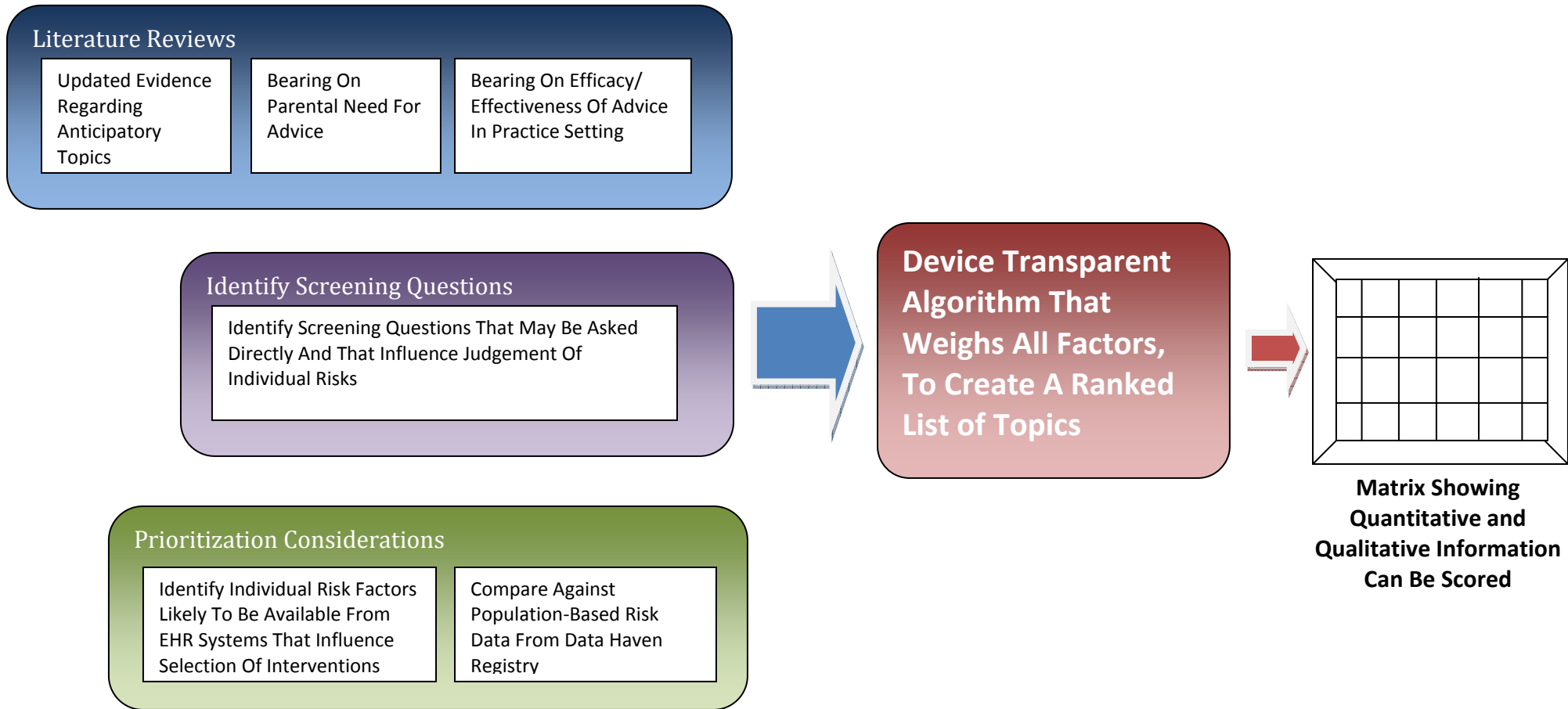


Example Approach For Prioritization of Recommendations
