## Fellowship Highlights

- Significant emphasis on EMS field operations, including frequent field response with the SHARP Team, our EMS physician response team – the only licensed team in the state
- Two dedicated EMS response vehicles
- Training/certification opportunities include EVOC, Hazmat Ops, ICS, Firefighter I & II, and Emergency Medical Dispatcher
- Extensive research opportunities in any area of EMS interest. This includes the opportunity to collaborate with other Yale programs, including public health, surgery, and biomedical engineering. Past research partners include the US Army Research Institute of Environmental Medicine, Fire Research Labs at the National Institute for Standards & Technology, the US Fire Administration, and the Oak Ridge and Sandia National Laboratories.
- Mass gathering medicine experience, including coverage of Yale athletics
- Travel to the NAEMSP and SAEM annual meetings protected & funded for the fellow



## The New Haven Area

- Vibrant college city of 130,000 on the coastline of Connecticut, with 800,000 residents in the surrounding county

## EMS In New Haven

- Yale New Haven Hospital Center for EMS provides medical oversight for over 335 paramedics, 700 EMTs, 115 first responders, and 275 dispatchers from 27 EMS agencies in the surrounding 12 towns (~400,000 residents)
- EMS services include 15 fire departments, 2 commercial EMS services, 4 police departments, 1 municipal third service, 3 student-based university EMS services, 1 industrial first responder, and the only EMS physician response team in the state.
- 85,000 EMS calls in our system annually, with over 71,000 ambulance arrivals at Yale New Haven Hospital emergency departments
- Oversight and teaching for the largest EMS training program in the state, including three paramedic programs.
