REMEDICATION

Background

It is the responsibility of the school to provide remediation for students having difficulty in clinical skills, including clinical reasoning, communication and professionalism. This gives students the opportunity to meet the expectations for performance prior to graduation.

Policy

1. Students in need of remediation may be identified by faculty involved in the curriculum.
2. The faculty member will:
 - Discuss concerns with the course, clerkship, elective or sub-I director. If agreement is reached that the student would benefit from remediation, the director will notify the student's academic advisor and the associate dean for student affairs in order to ensure appropriate oversight, guidance and support during the period of remediation.
3. The academic advisor will consult with the director of remediation, the associate dean for student affairs and the appropriate faculty to discuss the student's needs for remediation and determine the plan.
4. The academic advisor will meet with the student to discuss the plan, including timeline and expectations.
5. The student is required to successfully complete the remediation plan outlined by the academic advisor. Failure to do so will be reported to the Progress Committee so that appropriate action can be taken.
