Update from Protective Services

- Protective services are continuing to sponsor the decisions/implementations spearheaded by Anne Diamond and Ambulatory Services
- The script for the armed intruder video has been completed. The latest statistics and learnings have been added to the video.
- Parking update
  - Lot 47 will be back online.
  - Howard garage is being updated with new lights. The estimated completion date will be by summertime.
- Shuttle Route Update
  - Joe Carlino, Assistant Director, Transit Operations
  - Wooster Square/ Olive Street
    - Based on feedback, it is proposed to provide a shuttle service on a fixedstop route going down State Street, to Olive, and the Wooster Square area.
    - Transit operations want to eliminate the door-to-door service along Elm
       Street as 5-6 people ride that shuttle daily for over 7 hours. Efforts to extend the route are being made.
    - Feedback on the shuttle routes from students will be collected to help determine the best shuttle routes. Also to determine if routes should be fixed stops or door-to-door
  - Follow-up: Transit Operations to meet with the Medical Student Council to discuss shuttle routes.
- YSM (Yale School of Medicine) Mailboxes
  - No complaints have been received by Yale PD (Police Department) regarding stolen packages/mail from YSM.
  - Megan Nance, Head of Access & Delivery Services, shared that from January to mid-April, package thefts are now averaging two (2) packages a month.

- YSM Safety & Security Town Hall- April 10, 2024
  - Total attendance: 96 attendees; submitted questions during Q&A: 6 questions;
     advanced submitted questions: 6 questions.
  - Chief Campbell & Duane Lovello shared and discussed the assailant active shooter video.
    - Chief Campbell suggested once a quarter, inviting New Haven PD to communicate with the Yale community on the coordinating efforts and updates on what NHPD is doing around the city.
  - Follow-up: Invite the New Haven Police Department and New Haven Officials to the YSM Town Halls.
- Clinical Operations and Safety- Yale New Haven Health System
  - YNHHS (Yale New Haven Health System) is heavily focused on physical security.
    - YNHHS is currently assessing risk in the various facilities
    - Metal detectors and badge panic buttons are to be added.
    - Next phase: coordinated education and ongoing education using available tools such as the updated training and active assailant video.
- 135 College Street
  - o An incident of a mugging and computer theft was reported.
  - o Complaints about security profiling visitors have been received.
    - William (Bill) Goldbach and David Nevins were asked by Duane Lovello to evaluate the security options
    - Follow up: Recommendations for updated security in 135 College St. and leased-owned buildings
- Vision Zero Bill & Red Light/ Speeding Cameras
  - The city's Board of Alders held a joint Public Safety and Legislation Committee meeting, where they unanimously approved the Vision Zero legislation, which enables the city to implement speed and red-light cameras. They also unanimously approved the mayor's proposed 19 locations for the cameras. (On May 20, the full Board of Alders also unanimously approved the legislation and camera locations. The State still must approve the camera locations.)
