



Yale Urology is well on its way to becoming a destination urological center. We have achieved significant growth in our clinical volume, as well as meaningful progress in research and education.

Our clinical programs, particularly HoLEP, have attracted patients from beyond Connecticut. The prostate cancer program has also made strides in drawing patients by leveraging innovative clinical trials. Furthermore, our academic faculty and trainees have collectively published more than 100 manuscripts, reflecting our commitment to advancing knowledge in urology. I am pleased with the successful launch of the pilot grant program, as well, supporting innovative research ideas.



RECRUITMENT

Looking ahead, we will continue strategic recruitments of clinical faculty members. Additionally, we have placed significant emphasis on research growth, as evidenced by the ongoing national search for the vice chair of research and planned recruitment in biostatistics and bioinformatics. We also plan to hire clinical trials coordinators.



COLLABORATION

Breaking down silos and promoting intradepartmental collaboration remains a priority. The pilot grant program will continue, with plans to award four new grants amongst faculty, across our different divisions. Patient access is also an ongoing concern, and we are committed to collaborating with the Care Center to improve accessibility while aligning with Yale Medicine's overall strategic vision.
