ANNUAL BERNARD LYTON VISITING PROFESSOR DAY

The 2018 Bernard Lyton Visiting Professor Day was held on Thursday, June 14, and this year welcomed Andrew Kirsch, MD, Clinical Professor of Urology and Chief of Pediatric Urology from Emory University.

To kick off the full day of presentations and debates, Dr. Kirsch spoke on "New Insights into Vesicoureteral Reflux Diagnosis and Management." Throughout the remainder of the morning and into the afternoon sessions, residents presented on a variety of topics and participated in debates, with Dr. Kirsch providing insightful commentary. Near the close of the afternoon session, Dr. Kirsch divided the residents into two teams for a lively competition with the teams having to answer board exam and case questions.

Bernard Lyton Visiting Professor Day was named after Bernard Lyton, MD, who joined Yale Urology as Chief in 1967. While at Yale, with his colleague, Howard Levitin, MD, a nephrologist, Dr. Lyton opened the first dialysis clinic in Connecticut, making it possible to begin a program in renal transplantation at Yale. He was also the first to perform a kidney transplant in Connecticut, and was the force behind the start of many urologic programs.

On Thursday, June 14, Chief Residents Dinner took place at Union League Cafe, honoring graduating residents, **Shu Pan, MD** and **Charlotte Wu, MD**.
